INTRODUCTION

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME popularly known as NSS was launched in Gandhi's Birth Centenary Year 1969, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports Govt. of India. The scheme was launched simultaneously in 37 Universities covering all states. The organization now boasts of 75,000 active and dedicated student members, with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service and promotion of National solidarity.


In India, the idea of involving students in the task of national service, back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation. The first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods & services so essential to society. Advising them to form a living contact with the community in whose midst their institution is located, he suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do –

"Something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level".

The motto of NSS is:

“NOT ME, BUT YOU”,

Which is explanatory of the spirit the organization i.e., selfless service and understanding of other person's view point. It acknowledges the fundamental fact that individual welfare is ultimately dependent on community development.



Synopsis


The National Service Scheme unit camp was organized on 11th February 2018 at Basipipri, Badgaunda (MHOW) keeping the motto "Not Me But You" as its driving force. The village Basipipri is situated near Choral and is about 23kms away from the Medi-Caps University. The government school of the village was chosen as the camp site and the 50 volunteers resided there for seven days under the guidance of Program Officer, NSS Medi-Caps University unit.

A typical day at the camp used to begin at 5 am when for the next two hours the volunteers would participate in the yoga and meditation sessions. The breakfast was served at 7:30 a.m. after which the volunteers would proceed to perform Shramdaan which involved chores like cleaning the campus, filling water, preparing for lunch and digging drains. The volunteers would then proceed to freshen up and have lunch at 1 p.m. After the lunch everyone would gather to attend guest lectures where the dignitaries and the special guests would deliver their enlightening lessons and thoughts. By 4.30 p.m. evening tea was served after which the volunteers were given time for relaxation. 5 p.m. would witness a bustle in the campus as various cultural and co-curricular activities like NSS games, music and dance competition, nukkad natak etc. were organized during this time. These activities would go on for an hour after which dinner was served at 6:30 p.m. Everyone would then gather for daily re-evaluation and planning after which the lights were turned out at 8 p.m.

The volunteers took up various activities under the tenure of these seven days. They conducted surveys, visited schools, dug up irrigation channel and involved themselves in various acts to spread general awareness in the villagers.

The volunteers performed SHRAMDAAN in and around the campus in order to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in the area. Observing them perform such activities motivated the children and the villagers to maintain proper hygiene in the place they lived.

A team of volunteers visited the village to perform survey on behalf of Electoral Commission of India with an aim to enlist and register the people in the electoral list. Because of this survey the volunteers were able to closely observe and understand the problems and difficulties the villages faced in their everyday life. This provided them opportunity to work for the betterment and welfare of the villagers.

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
They also visited the local government school, Shaskiya Madhyamic Vidyalaya and got the opportunity to interact with the children. The volunteers educated them about the importance of cleanliness, proper waste disposal and motivated them to use toilets. They also taught them basic subjects and general knowledge.

Volunteers also teamed up to perform various nukkads in the village on topics like "Right to information" , "Jai Jawan Jai Kisan" , "Red Ribbon", "Election" and "Importance of girl child".

The safety and security of the camp was taken well-care of by the program officer. A team of volunteers was set-up which used to ensure the discipline and decorum was well maintained in the camp.

The trekking to choral dam and the temple visit to mahadev khodra were yet an unusual experience for the volunteers which taught them important skills and values.

The celebration of the Cultural Day was enchanting as all the volunteers performed with great deal and enthusiasm. The seven days turned out to be a learning and growing experience for all the volunteers. The interaction and work they did for the welfare for the betterment of the community granted them satisfaction and helped them realize the true meaning of the motto "NOT ME BUT YOU".




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Camp Leaders and Organizing Committee



Right from their first day, NSS volunteers took this task in their hands and did everything possible to make life better for the people there. They make sure that those seven days will bring a little change for the betterment of people.


NSS volunteers did all kind of work there from plantation to digging a compost pit. They also constructed water drawing channel in the premises and also cleaned the entire premises. Not only this, they also interacted with the children their and impart knowledge to the students in the government school. They did not stop themselves there but indeed they made a visit to the village asking them about their living status and their needs. Also a rally was conducted where general awareness sloganeering was done. Also “nukkad nataks” were performed with very strong social messages.

The very first activity which the volunteers performed there was digging a compost pit. A proper strategy was adopted by the volunteers for the pit and then proper usage of the same was followed for the seven days. Every volunteer there was instructed about what all should go inside and then on the last day the compost pit was covered properly in order to make sure that the pit provide a little help to people there.

Another important activity performed by the volunteers was the cleaning of the premises. Entire school right from the playground to the rooms were thoroughly cleaned and sterilized. Volunteers even levelled the playground by removing stones and other dirt particles .The cleaning of kitchen was given more importance in order to insure good health to volunteers and children there.

Another important task was drawing a water drawing channel in the premises as there were some drainage issues. The volunteers along with their team work and dedication performed this service with great efficiency.

Not only small necessities but also they laid emphasis on beautifying the premises. Plantation was done where plants with medicinal usage such as neem




and ashok were planted. Not only the plants were planted in the premises but also they were taken great care of for next seven days.

Also the volunteers made a village visit where they interacted with the villagers. They inquired them about their well-being and also about their general needs. They asked them about the problems they are facing and also told them some measures and techniques to overcome them. Along with the village visit a rally took place where volunteers covered every single area of the village along with sloganeering. Also the slogans recited were based on social issues.

Last but not the least nukkad nataks were performed in the village on social issues like woman empowerment, literacy, alcoholism and importance of farmers and soldiers. These nukkad nataks were performed by the volunteers with the spirit of rendering something good to the society.



On the fourth day some social awakening skits and natak were prepared and performed by NSS volunteers. Lecture Session






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Survey report on Basipipri

NSS volunteers did a survey in the village. About 39 volunteers divided themselves into groups and went to streets, lanes, by-lanes under the observation of their seniors and program officer. A door to door contact was done to get the required data and know their problems. Their response was excellent as many came forward to share the required data and problems. It was felt that a sense of awareness is rising in the community. People knew the importance of education, cleanliness.

Volunteers got to know the lifestyle and struggles of the people in village. Volunteers also got to know that the major problem in the village was scarcity of water during summer. There are only few water resources left during that time of year when they have to bring water from distant places.
